Nonviolent Crisis Intervention

What is Nonviolent Crisis Intervention Training?

This Introductory Level Training Program consists of crisis intervention techniques, both verbal and physical, that provide care, welfare, safety and security for everyone involved in a crisis situation. The goal of this program is to teach foster parents proactive strategies ~ to prevent a crisis from escalating ~ with an emphasis on communication skills.

BASIC PROGRAM

The Basic Program is for foster parents who have not taken NVCi before or whose NVCi certification has expired (more than 13 months since last certification) and they are required to repeat the Basic program. This introductory program consists of twelve hours of training over a 2 day period.

Mission Statement

The Federation of Foster Families of Nova Scotia is a collective voice for all foster parents in Nova Scotia. In pursuit of this mission, the Federation will ensure assistance and support for foster families and Foster Family Associations.



COMPETENCY PAYMENTS ELIGIBILITY

Introductory Level of Care (A) - \$3.00 per day requirements are (1) completion of Foster Family Orientation Program or PRIDE Pre-Service Program or Grandfathered in July 1, 1998; (2) completion of Nonviolent Crisis Intervention 'Basic' Program; (3) yearly Nonviolent Crisis Intervention 'Refresher' Program, if applicable; (4) completion of Sensitivity Training for Foster Families Program; (5) 2 years fostering experience and (6) approval from your Home Agency.

Introductory Level of Care (B) - \$5.00 per day requirements are (1) Introductory Level of Care (A); (2) completion of yearly Nonviolent Crisis Intervention 'Refresher' Program; (3) completion of PRIDE Module 1 and PRIDE Module 2 and (4) approval from your Home Agency.

Advanced Level of Care - \$10.00 per day requirements are (1) Introductory Level of Care (B); (2) five years experience and (3) approval from your Home Agency.
